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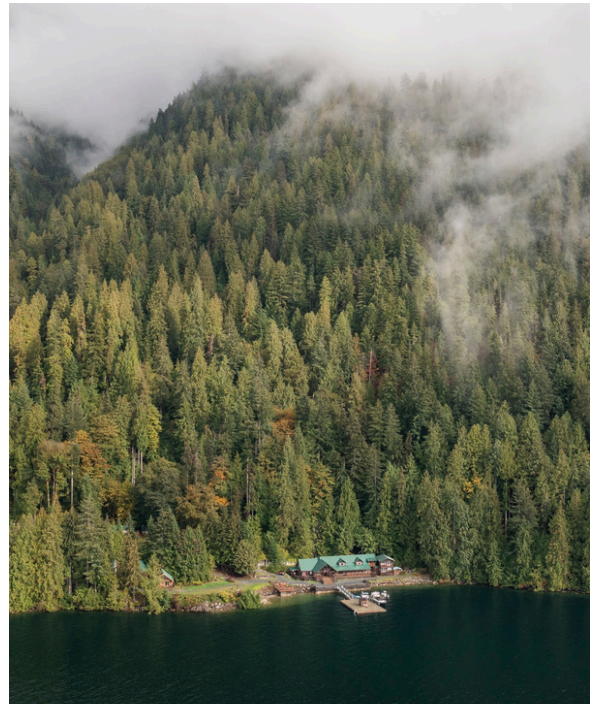

THE RESORT EXPERIENCE

Guests at Klahoose Wilderness Resort embark on an immersive Indigenous-led journey, where the rhythm of the tides shapes each day's adventure. From the thrill of viewing grizzly bears during the annual salmon run and humpback whales in their natural habitat to the quiet power of traditional cedar-brushing-off ceremonies and storytelling, every stay blends wild coastal nature with meaningful cultural connection. Whether paddling the turquoise waters of Desolation Sound or reflecting in the wood-fired floating sauna, visitors experience a rare and regenerative connection to the ancestral lands of the Klahoose First Nation.

Why it matters: Purchased by the Klahoose First Nation in 2020, Klahoose Wilderness Resort has become one of Canada's leading Indigenous tourism experiences. Every stay directly supports the Nation through employment, cultural revitalization, and stewardship of traditional lands.

SEASONAL PACKAGES

Inclusive Stays are 3-, 4-, or 7-night immersive Indigenous-led journeys:

- Discover Klahoose (May-August)

Marine-based wildlife viewing including humpback whales, orcas, waterfalls, and spring bear viewing by boat.

- Grizzly Bears of Toba Inlet (Late August-October)

Land-based grizzly bear viewing from exclusive platforms during the annual salmon run.

FOOD

- Meals are included from dinner on arrival to breakfast on departure. Menus are inspired by the Salish Sea, featuring locally sourced seafood such as BC albacore tuna and cedar-plank-salmon, alongside seasonal and locally sourced ingredients.

- In-Room: Private oceanfront balconies, ensuites, plush robes, Indigenous products, and Nespresso service.

SUSTAINABILITY

- 100% Off-Grid: Powered by a state-of-the-art micro-hydroelectric system; GreenStep Silver Certified.
- Indigenous-Led: 100% Indigenous-owned; every stay directly supports cultural revitalization, Indigenous tourism, wildlife and habitat protection.

ACCESS & LOGISTICS

- By Air: 35-minute flight from Vancouver (YVR) to Powell River (YPW), followed by a short transfer to Lund.
- By Water: 60-minute scenic boat transfer from Lund (included).
- Private Access: Seaplane dock, helipad, and deep-water moorage available.
